Your union's boycott of Virgin Hotels Las Vegas has been approved for addition to the list of national boycotts endorsed by the AFL-CIO.

In accordance with the policy on boycott endorsements adopted by the AFL-CIO Executive Council, the federation will maintain this boycott on its published boycott list for one year from the date of endorsement, unless your union requests an earlier termination of the listing. At the end of the year, you may request to have Virgin Hotels Las Vegas on the list for another 12 months.
