Dear Brother Cummings:

Your union's boycott of T-Mobile, with headquarters at 12920 SE 38th St., Bellevue, WA 98006 and stores nationwide, has been approved for addition to the list of national boycotts endorsed by the AFL-CIO.

In accordance with the policy on boycott endorsements adopted by the AFL-CIO Executive Council, the federation will maintain this boycott on its published boycott list for one year from the date of endorsement, unless your union requests an earlier termination of the listing. At the end of the year, you may request to have T-Mobile on the list for another 12 months.

The AFL-CIO will post notice of this boycott on its website, and the Union Label and Service Trades Department will post notice of this boycott to the list on its website and the Label Letter publication when you are ready to announce the boycott.
